DEVELOPMENT ACT: ENSURING QUALITY OF SEEDS
AND PLANTING MATERIALS



DECLARATION OF POLICY

Promote and accelerate the development of the seed industry through:

- a.Conservation, preservation and development of the plant genetic resources of the nation;
- b.Encouraging and hastening of organization of all sectors engaged in the industry, integrate all their activities and provide assistance to them;
- c.Consideration of the seed industry as a preferred area of investment;
- d.Encouraging the private sector to engage in seed research and development and in mass production and distribution of good quality seeds; and
- e. Providing the local industry protection against unfair competition from imported seeds.

VARIETY TESTING FOR ACCREDITATION AND REGISTRATION

The National Cooperative Test (NCT)- a variety or an entry is grown together with the national check variety for agronomic and or horticultural performance evaluation.

- a. Undertaken for two distinct seasons in a year -dry and wet
- b. It usually takes a minimum of two years to complete an NCT

The NCT of Fruit and Ornamental Crops

- a. The Fruit entry variety is usually evaluated for 3 fruiting seasons or cycles
- b. Ornamental crops are evaluated to two or more flowering or growth cycles

BENEFITS DERIVED FROM USING NSIC-ACCREDITED VARIETIES

- a. Farmers are assured of the quality of the seeds that they will cultivate;
- b. Farmers can avail of farming loans from government lending institutions;
- c. Farmers can obtain crop insurance:
- d. Farmers are informed of the source of the varieties of their choice;
- e. Consumers' choice among quality farm produce
